- Demonstrate the three purposes of the EC: ensure compliance with community floodplain management ordinances, determine the proper insurance premium rate, and support a request for a Letter of Map Amendment (LOMA) or Letter of Map Revision Based on Fill (LOMR-F).
- Review the requirements for survey, flood opening documentation and certifications, building diagrams, BFE determination and documentation requirements, common errors and omissions, and discrepancies between different regulatory and programmatic requirements.






Disaster Resources Team

<u>Proposed Rule Changes coming to FHA and HUD via Federal Flood Risk Management Standard (FFRMS)</u>

The Federal Housing Administration (FHA) via the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has proposed a rule change to align FHA with existing floodplain management regulations followed by other HUD programs like CDBG-DR and CDBG-MIT. These regulations are known as the Federal Flood Risk Management Standard, or FFRMS.

FFRMS rules require critical actions on critical facilities within the 1% and 2% floodplains to be elevated to either 2 or 3 feet above the BFE. HUD's Disaster Programs (CDBG-DR and CDBG-MIT for example) have-along with FEMA and its Mitigation Programs like PA and HMA-long aligned with FFRMS. The proposed rule changes require FHA to begin to adhere to the same standards.

Requirements of FFRMS will include the use of 2 to 3 foot freeboard in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) along with removal of exceptions allowing the use of LOMA's, LOMAR-F's, CLOMA's and CLOMAR-F's in achieving the specified Freeboard Requirements. If FFRMS guidelines are not met from a design guidance and construction standard perspective, the project or structure will not qualify for financing using FHA products which are key tool in the affordable housing market. Nor will it qualify for the use of FHA Mortgage Insurance, regardless of the financing source.
